PAST TENSE, FUTURE IMPERFECT is an exhibition based on the conflation of several concepts:

Ridley Scott's futuristic (2019) vision of LA in Blade Runner, with its hallmarks of disfiguring pollution, corporate gluttony, media assault, and dystopian architecture; and the plastic properties of both time and space. Memory is reconstructive, and recollection involves piecing together specific details of the event, mixing these with our own biases and beliefs. It is because of the reconstructive nature of memory that we are able to travel forward in time as well as back into the past.

Hollywood is part of the city formerly known as El Pueblo de Nuestra Señora la Reina de Los Angeles, ground zero for movies that have constructed scenarios of malleable memory and Dali-esque time travel, like the recent films Looper and Memento, among other examples. The artists chosen for this exhibition address the spectrum of memory functions and perturbations, from total recall to confabulatory hypermnesia, in constructing and remembering future memories.
